Prize money

First prize is an award of two thousand euros. Second prize is an award of one thousand euros, and third prize is five hundred euros.

About the prize

In 2018, the United Evangelical Mission (UEM) once again will award a Partnership Prize for the best partnership projects in Africa, Asia, and Germany. This decision was taken at the UEM General Assembly. This time, the focus shall be on projects of and for women, with the important stipulation that the target groups be involved from the beginning. The most outstanding partnership projects will be presented during the General Assembly of 2018 and awarded monetary prizes ranging from five hundred to two thousand euros.

Eligibility

All partnership groups within the UEM are eligible to apply for the prize.

Prize jury

The UEM Partnership Committee will decide which projects to recognise with the Partnership Prize.

Project criteria

- 1. The project aims at promoting women's initiatves.
- 2. The target group should be involved from the outset.
- 3. The form of the project is not fixed: it can be a campaign, a creative project, or even a "classic" partnership project in development policy.
- 4. The project should be based on the **criteria** of the UEM's official project seal:



Decided by partners

A joint decision has been taken by the participating partners to apply for the UEM Partnership Prize.

Joint planning, monitoring, and evaluation

The project is implemented through joint planning, monitoring, and evaluation (PME).

Project planning in various dimensions

At least two of the following five work areas of the UEM should be considered during the project planning:

Advocacy/Legal aid

Diaconia

Development

Evangelism

Partnerships

The project can be planned for both/all participating regions where applicable.

Educational implementation

Local churches, groups and institutions in the participating partner countries should support the project by offering seminars, conferences, events, and other activities.

Outreach

The local church and/or non-religious media should report on events, seminars, and activities related to the ongoing project.
