Afro-Reggae Meets Climate Justice

Tanzanian-German band Rise'n'Shine kicks off tour on September 5 in church circuit of Bonn

(Wuppertal/Bonn, September 5, 2025) – Rousing music, clear messages, and active international partnership: The Tanzanian-German band *Rise'n'Shine* kicks off its current tour in Bonn under the motto "Voices of Climate Justice." The tour begins on Friday, September 5, at 7:00 p.m. at the *American Protestant Church* in Bad Godesberg.

The opening concert is hosted by the Committee for Partnership and Global Ecumenism of the Protestant Church District of Bonn. There is a special connection here: lead singer Anne-Christina Achterberg Boness, who grew up in Tanzania, recently became a fundraiser for the church district.

Rise'n'Shine combines Afro-reggae with African fusion, gospel, and jazz to create a distinctive sound. Their songs, sung in English, Swahili, and German, convey a message of peace, love, and unity in diversity. The band's lyrics promote social justice, respect, and climate protection. Their music moves, inspires, and invites you to groove along.

"Together we can do it!"

"With their energetic music full of original songs, the musicians want to motivate young people in particular to take action against the climate crisis," says Pastor Helmut Müller from the Cologne-Bonn Regional Service of the United Evangelical Mission (UEM), who is part of the organizing team. "Despite the already noticeable threatening effects of the crisis in Tanzania, the band members radiate a positive attitude that is contagious. *Pumoja zumawesa* – 'Together we can do it!' – is their credo."

In addition to the concerts, the church district is organizing over 20 workshops in schools, with confirmation groups, and in communities together with the band.
